Community Investment Strategy

- Community Investment invests around \$330 million in community based social services each year
- Services help support our most vulnerable children, young people and adults to be safe, strong and independent
- Aims to provide clarity about priorities for funding for next three years
- Based on evidence of what works
- Purchase targeted social services



Strategy based on

Six key elements:

- Focus more clearly on priority results
- Build the evidence base
- Improve the quality of data collection
- Set a clear direction for future funding
- Further simplify compliance requirements
- Continue to build provider capability.


