Isafe is a confidential, online, interactive safety decision tool developed for NZ women. In the **isafe study** we are testing whether the tool improves the safety and wellbeing of women in unsafe or abusive relationships.

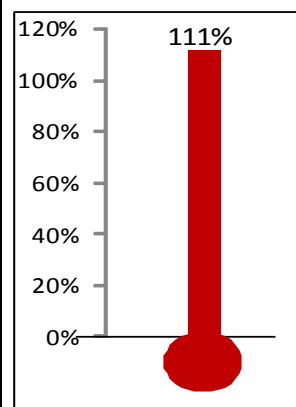
